Chairman Bell called the meeting to order. Vice Chairman Bolding made a motion to approve the minutes of the December 13<sup>th</sup> meeting, seconded by Mr. Sloan, approved 4-0.

Mr. Bell opened the floor for nominations of a new Chairman and Mr. Bolding nominated Harry Bell. Seconded by Mullican the board voted 4-0. Next Chairman Bell asked for Vice Chairman nominations. Mr. Sloan made a motion to nominated Henry Bolding for Vice Chair, seconded by Mr. Mullican the board voted 4-0.

Old Business on the agenda consisted of Long Hollow Winery song writer's nights. Previously Mr. Phillips had been before the board and granted a temporary permit. Today Mr. Phillips asked the board for a break of more time to figure out how to get more people to Long Hollow Winery. Chairman Bell clarified that he would not be selling beer during his break and Mr. Phillips agreed. Mr. Phillips asked to be able to come back before the board at a later date when he could get more people in. Mr. Ellis explained to the board they could grant him the extension of time and that amount of time would be the board's decision. Mr. Ellis recommended not going past twelve months. Mr. Ellis also clarified the type of beer permits that would be necessary depending on the type of events Mr. Phillips chooses to have at the winery. Discussion of the board ensued and Mr. Bolding made a motion to defer the permit for up to one year of the application date. Mr. Mullican seconded the motion and the board voted 4-0.

For new business, Mr. Elvis Pretrick represented Kabuto's as the General Manager for a complaint that was filed against Kabuto's Steak and Sushi. Officer Knalls was called to the stand to represent the police departments allegations against Kabuto's. Officer Knalls was dispatched to Hendersonville Hospital on the morning of December 19<sup>th</sup> for an assault victim. The victim, Ms. Harris, stated she was an employee at Kabuto's. The doctor informed Officer Knalls that Ms. Harris had suffered from a concussion and may not be able to remember a lot. In speaking with Ms. Harris, and the individual that drove her to the hospital, they were both in agreement that she had attended Kabuto's after-hours Christmas party and that she was intoxicated. Ms. Brittany Harris is only 20 years old. The assault that took place outside of the restaurant is still under investigation. Officer Knalls also spoke

with Ms. Barbosa, a manager at Kabuto's, and she told him that she had been serving drinks that night. Ms. Barbosa didn't have much to say about the assault.

Mr. Pretrick came back to the stand and stated that he went to Sam's earlier that day and that he bought a couple of cases of beer for his employees. He placed the beer in ice bins on the counter top and left them there. Chairman Bell asked Mr. Pretrick if he was aware of Ms. Harris' age that night. Mr. Pretrick said he wasn't aware or paying attention if she was drinking or if she had been given a drink. When questioned Mr. Pretrick stated he was unaware of anyone serving drinks. Chief Goodwin questioned Mr. Pretrick about prior incidents at his establishment resulting in crimes being reported. Mr. Pretrick wasn't aware of any. Chief Goodwin asked Mr. Pretrick if he wasn't aware of the incident in 2014 with two intoxicated employee's that resulted in a stabbing, he wasn't aware of the incident. He was questioned a second time about not knowing the age of his employees and made sure he was under the correct understanding that he was responsible for the after-hours activities.

Officer Knalls was brought back before the board to verify that Ms. Barbosa did state she had been serving alcohol. He verified that she did in fact state she had served alcohol during her interview at her home on Canton Court. Officer Knalls has this information on his body cam footage. The board discussed their options between a fine and license suspension. City Manager Ellis stated that Mr. Pretrick said no one was serving behind the bar and that the Police Department has video footage of his wife stating she did serve behind the bar. Chief Goodwin questioned if the owner of Kabuto's was aware of this situation and Mr. Pretrick said Mr. Yoon was not aware yet. More discussion followed with possible options to take and Mr. Bolding made a motion to fine Kabuto's \$1250.00 for violations of underage drinking to be paid in 24 hours. Seconded by Mr. Mullican the board voted 4-0.

Chairman Bell wants to look into sending out new permits with an expiration date every year. When the licensee's pay the yearly privilege tax, these new licenses would be mailed out at that time. Mr. Ellis agreed that was a good idea and mentioned discussing changing the color of the permit each year as well. This would make it easier for the police department to identify a valid permit when they entered into an establishment.

With no other business to discuss Mr. Bolding made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mr. Sloan. Meeting adjourned at 9:33.
