Chairman Harry Bell called the meeting to order. Mr. Henry Bolding made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 10th meeting, seconded by Mr. Jerry Mayes, approved 5-0.

No citizen comments.

Staff comments. City Manager Tim Ellis would like the board to have an August meeting to discuss changes to the beer ordinance. Mr. Ellis suggested Special Venue Classification be better defined and updates to the ordinance where it states that certain facilities are allowed to have special events. One of these facilities will be turned into government offices with this fiscal year budget.

Sidney Langston (Incorrectly referred to as Sidney Lancaster in posted Beer Board Agenda) represented Sand Trap @ Twelve Stones located at 1201 Twelve Stones Crossing. Chairman Bell confirmed that Mr. Langston was 100% owner of Sand Trap and had bought out the previous owners. Mr. Langston affirmed that there would be no change in operation of the restaurant. Discussion ensued between the board and the staff regarding the proper permit to issue regarding the golf course permit as well as a restaurant permit. It was determined that the golf course had their own permit and that Mr. Langston would require a dual permit to cover all necessary scenarios. Mr. Jerry Mayes made a motion to approve the Sand Trap's dual Golf Course/Restaurant Beer Permit. Seconded by Mr. Bolding approved 5-0.

Chairman Bell questioned the status of Big Shakes restaurant. Mr. Ellis updated the board that the applicant had some issues on their application that may indicate difficulty obtaining a beer permit. The restaurant also has an exit issue to comply with fire and life safety regulations per Goodlettsville Codes Department. They are able to have enough seating to allow a beer permit, but not enough exits from the building. Mr. Ellis stated that Codes had been working with the restaurant and he suggested a deferment to allow them time to comply. Discussion ensued regarding a proper timeline

to complete necessary requirements. Mr. Henry Bolding made a motion to defer Big Shakes Nashville Hot Chicken to allow time to comply, up to 60 days. Mr. Sloan seconded the motion, the board voted 5-0.

Mr. Bolding made a motion to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Mr. Sloan the board voted 5-0. Meeting adjourned at 9:17.
